I am pleased to announce the appointment of Dr. Leonard Krilov as the Chairman of the Department of Pediatrics at Winthrop-University Hospital effective July 1, 2016. Dr. Krilov, has been a clinical and academic leader at Winthrop-University Hospital for 16 years. As chairman of the department of pediatrics, Dr. Krilov will be instrumental in broadening the scope, reach and services of the Children's Medical Center at Winthrop.

A native of New York, Dr. Krilov earned his undergraduate degree from Brandeis University and his medical degree from the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Columbia University. He completed his internship and residency at Johns Hopkins Hospital and a fellowship in Pediatric Infectious Disease at Children's Hospital in Boston. Following his training, he began his career at the Schneider Children's Hospital of the Long Island Jewish Medical Center. Dr. Krilov has held the academic ranks of Professor of Clinical Pediatrics at New York University School of Medicine and is currently Professor of Pediatrics at State University of New York at Stony Brook.

As an expert in the specialty of Pediatric Infectious Diseases, Dr. Krilov's research focus is in the prevention of Respiratory Syncytial Virus. He has published over 95 peer reviewed articles and 50 book chapters. He is a current reviewer of a number of pediatric and infectious disease journals including Pediatrics, Journal of Pediatrics and the Pediatric Infectious Disease Journal. Additionally, Dr. Krilov is an editor for Concise Reviews in Infectious Diseases (past), Pediatric Annals, PREP self-assessment, eMedicine and Infectious Disease Practice.
